### Stations of the Resurrection

Dear Grace Church Family,

First and above all else, a blessed and joyous Easter season to all of the members of our Parish Family. Also, a profound thank you to all of you who supported our shared Lenten and Holy Week observances with Pastor Julie and our brothers and sisters from Our Savior's Lutheran Church (OSLC). I also want to thank all those who worked so hard at Grace and OSLC to do the planning and logistical work for the services. I especially want to thank CJ, Art, Mei, the choir and the Altar Guild for all of their hard work. I have heard many positive comments about our sharing and expressions of support for doing it again. We will start to discuss other sharing opportunities with our OSLC friends in the next few weeks and see where we go moving forward.

One of the opportunities for liturgical sharing that we had during Holy Week was the Good Friday liturgy (at GEC at Noon and OSLC at 7:00pm). Part of our liturgy at Noon was the use of the Stations of the Cross following the conclusion of the Good Friday liturgy from the Book of Common Prayer. The Way of the Cross/Stations of the Cross is an ancient form provided for individual and group devotion to the Cross and to the Passion of Our Lord. It is used in many different Christian traditions and not just during Lent and on penitential occasions. The design of the devotion of the Stations is to encourage the one praying these steps to walk with Jesus during His Passion. Opportunities like the Stations were particularly important when the majority of the community were not able to read.

In the last few years, other "journey" or pilgrimage devotions have appeared. One that has gained some attention is the Stations of the Resurrection. These stations, following the same format and approach offering the one using them the opportunity to walk with Jesus, help to connect us with the risen Lord during the "post resurrection" journey that leads, ultimately at the end of the fifty days of the Easter season, to the great feast of Pentecost.

Let me invite all of us to consider how we might use this devotional opportunity in our lives during Eastertide. The Stations can be prayed in the Church using the same fourteen crosses on our nave walls that we use for the Stations of the Cross or, as the weather gets more "spring like" outside in the memorial garden. The Stations of the Resurrection can be a resource to keep our attention focused on the true meaning of Easter and not on the fleeting commercialism of peeps, chocolate bunnies or other secular expressions of the Easter season.

If too would like more information about how to pray the Stations of the Resurrection, please speak to CJ or to me. In the meantime, revel in the solemnity, the hope and the promise of the Resurrection.

Please note that 2 specific receipts need to be forwarded as expenses next month. The Good Friday and loose Holy week donations get sent to the Church in Jerusalem, and the ECW Luncheon payments get forwarded to cover that event.

Our new 2016/2016 Stewardship program started out fairly well, all things considered. We have received a total of 27 pledge cards so far which is just about half of the number of pledge envelopes being used. The indicated total estimated level of giving so far is \$72,860 toward the overall budget estimate of just over \$100,000.
