Who Are You Waiting For?

Dear Grace Church Family,

One Sunday morning I found one of the younger members of the congregation (David was 5 at the time) standing in front of the altar in the church. He stood very still and seemed to be waiting for someone or something. I asked him who he was waiting for and he pointed to the stained glass window above the altar with its representation of the Nativity and simply said, "Jesus". What more needed to be said? It was early in the season of Advent and in the Church School everyone was talking about the coming of the expected one and with all the conversation, David was very sure about what he was doing and hoped that the Holy child would hurry up and get here so that Christmas could begin. Of course we, as sophisticated grownups (are we?) know that while Advent is about the first coming of Jesus (this is what all the increasingly secular hoop-la is all about) it is more importantly about his second coming. So, what do we do about these in between times for only the Father knows when the Son will come again?

I think that the answer has to do with using this season to see Jesus in those around us. In seeking the Holy One, we will open ourselves, even if it is just a little bit, to the hope, the grace and above all the love which are hallmarks of God's kingdom and the heralds of the second coming. If you would seek Jesus in this way do not look for him just in the familiar places and in those whom you know best. Rather look for him in the unfamiliar places, in the faces of strangers and in those moments when you least expect to find him. Advent is for searching, it is for waiting, it is for hoping for God's promised gift and it is about faithful working and watching to use the gifts we have been given for nurturing and extending God's mission.

We affirm that we are God's people on mission. If we truly believe this then Advent is our season to open our hearts and our resources to seek out and welcome those whom God sends our war or to whom God leads us in our spiritual journeying. So as the secular countdown to Christmas continues, let us focus on what is really the work of this holy season and prepare ourselves to look for Jesus in those around us.

In Whistling in the Dark (HarperOne), Frederick Buechner compares Advent to the moments right before a symphony conductor raises the baton to begin a much-anticipated performance. "You hold your breath to listen," he writes. "You are aware of the beating of your heart. The extraordinary thing that is about to happen is matched only by the extraordinary moment just before it happens. Advent is the name of that moment."

During December, silence can seem elusive, Buechner admits. But "if you concentrate just for an instant, far off in the deeps somewhere you can feel the beating of your heart. For all its madness and lostness, not to mention your own, you can hear the world holding its breath."



Capital Campaign and General Money Market Update: At the end of October, the overall Money Market account balance was \$55,661. Of this amount, the major elements are still: \$23,868 as the posted Capital Campaign balance, and \$15,142 as the posted net Rectory balance (\$1,500 Security Deposit + \$13,642 Rectory Reserves). General Fund Update: October puts most of 2015 behind us. Overall income was above average mostly due to the successful Fall Fair, and to US Mail timing giving us both September and October Rectory Rent checks to deposit. Expenses were nominal, giving us another positive month when reviewing our operating income vs. expenses. In fact we show a positive \$2,800 for our year to date operating figures. Looking at our overall checkbook balance as presented below, we have shown in excess of \$10,000 since June when we received a \$4,200 insurance refund from the Diocese. Considering this, the Vestry approved returning \$5,112 to our Money Market reserves to replace funds we "borrowed" back in 2013 which we have been carrying on our books

since. Thanks to everyone who is helping out with your time, talent, and treasure.
