We wish you all the Blessings of Christmas.



Creative Energy Team December 2020

Hello from your Creative Energy Team,

We are finishing up the Clothing Drive which is our last fundraiser for this year. The Clothing Drive has been very successful this year. We believe it is because of several reasons but mainly due to the pandemic. One reason being everyone having time to clean out their closets. Then there was nowhere to bring that clothing because many donation centers have been shut down. Our team used free publicity in the Rare Reminder and on Facebook to have people come donate clothing in garbage bags at any time day or night. It was to be placed at our front entrance in our next to the large blue tub. This approach seemed to work for us. One of us would go every day to check and bring any clothing inside.

We spent time counting all the bags, bringing them to the Narthex the day before and then loading them onto a truck. The first load we brought to Savers in Newington on October 13, 2020. We brought in 188 bags which raised \$376.20. Our second load brought to Savers on November 24, 2020 was 3567 lbs. resulting in a payment of \$714.30. With both deliveries to Savers, our clothing drive raised \$1090.50!!!!

Thank you to all who helped in the various ways. Whether it was donating, bringing clothing inside, counting or lugging and tugging the bags of clothing. Some people came every time we asked, some helped one or two times while some helped just once. It all makes for a fundraiser that was successful. Besides our team which consists of Lynn Page, Jane Stewart, Lorraine Belyea and myself, we also had help from Mark Shoemaker, CJ Puskarz, JoAnn Cromwell, Walt Parker, Laura Lynch, Brandon Johnson, Mitch Page, Benjamin Page, Michelle Dumont, Drew Correa & Marty Dumont. Thank you also to anyone else that helped bring bags of clothing in. It is all appreciated.
