## You are Invited, in the Name of the Church, to the Observance of a Holy Lent...

Dear Grace Church Family,

With the words above (found on page 265 as part of the Lenten invitation) we are reminded that we have taken a turn in our yearly pilgrimage with Jesus and are now intentionally turning with him towards Jerusalem and the next great act in the drama of salvation. We are being called to reflect during these days and weeks of Lent on the reality of the Passion which we know must proceed the gift of the Resurrection. It has been customary to observe this penitential season by self-examination, reflection, study and fellowship. This year here at Grace, we are sharing the Lenten journey with our sisters and brothers of Our Savior's Lutheran Church. Our Lenten pilgrimage together will begin on Shrove Tuesday (the traditional pancake supper) and continue through the Great Vigil of Easter. 
