St Brigid: The original patroness saint of Ireland

February 1<sup>st</sup> is the feast day of St. Brigid of Ireland, the patron saint who was overshadowed in stature by the decision to make St. Patrick the patron saint of Ireland. The reasons for consigning Brigid to a lesser role are unclear, but it could be tied to the fact that Brigid was also a character in the Celtic nature religion of Ireland before the Christianization of the land.

Like most saints, the facts of Brigid's life are difficult to parse from the mythology that grew up around her. St. Brigid of Kildare was born in about 450 and died in 523 AD or CE. Her father may have been a chieftain of Leinster, though she herself may have been born into slavery.

Several miracles are associated with her early life, as well as acts of mercy including healing and feeding the poor. As she grew in stature as a holy woman, she was invited to found a monastery at Kildare, the site of a pagan shrine to the pagan goddess Brigid, served by a group of young women who tended an eternal flame, under a large oak tree. One monastery for women and another for men was founded at the site. Brigid is revered also for her heart for the poor.

Brigid's popularity as a saint has made the name Brigid popular in Ireland over the centuries. When Roman Christianity spread throughout Ireland, replacing Celtic Christianity as the dominant culture, Brigid was replaced by Patrick, who was a Roman citizen as the primary patron saint. The conflation of the saint Brigid with the Celtic goddess, Bridget or Bride, may also be the reason. The goddess may be the continuation of the Indo-European dawn goddess, associated with fertility, who was also referred to as a healer and an iron worker—a sort of trinity. In an age when the Christian church was determined to eradicate pagan traditions, veneration of the saint, Brigid was seen as a threat to keeping the Christian faith free of its Celtic vestiges.


