Dear Grace Church Family,

We have only just embarked on the new year 2015 and already we are reminded that this will be a decisive year for us as the baptismal community of Grace Church here in Newington. We hope and pray that we will complete the work of calling a new priest to this congregation and we look forward to all that will mean. We are just into the season of Epiphany that reminds us of the central wok of Christians which is evangelism and mission. We will be spending time looking at these two aspects of our lives both individually and as a congregation beginning in Lent (not too far away as Ash Wednesday is on February 18) and continuing through the Easter season.

We need your energy, your commitment, your faithful stewardship, your participation and especially your prayers.

General Fund Update:

It is hard to believe that 2014 is now behind us. We managed to stay solvent all through the year without using any of the \$4,500 from our Money Market reserves as originally budgeted. In fact, after adjusting for 3 significant transactions, our overall expenses (and income) were below budget. In August, a special donation of \$7,500 was received and subsequently expensed as a transfer to the separate Money

Market reserves account. In December, \$1,200 was transferred from our reserves to cover a special advance retainer payment for a special event to be held later in 2015. This expense should be recovered when we hold the event, and could hopefully be returned to the reserves. Also in December, a \$6,500 fund adjustment was made as a receipt/expense from the General Fund. Adjusting total expense figure shown below by subtracting the \$15,200 detailed above shows an adjusted expense of \$145,209 (\$8,958 less than budgeted). Despite the adjusted income shown below being (subtract the \$15,200) being \$2,876 less than budget, the cash balance in our General Fund checkbook grew by \$6,089.

Please note the several activities really helped us this year. Our renewed fair and other fundraisers, the special "Back to Black" envelope, using the rectory rent as income, and the various groups contributing toward the use of the building all were welcome contributions. Our new "Grace Fund" was able to help a parishioner in need, and has already been more than replaced. All that being said, we also need to remember that our expenses are definitely less than "normal" with employment of our part-time Interim Rector, and by using volunteer help to partially make up for not having a paid Sexton in place. Your yearend 2014 statements should be available shortly. Please review them carefully for accuracy and to review your intended level of giving. Also remember that our pledge year now goes from April 1 to March 31. Hopefully everyone can at least maintain their current pledge until March, and can then renew their own personal commitment for another year after that. As we get ready for 2015 and a new budget, the Vestry and Finance Committee have some serious decisions to make to get ready to support a new settled rector. Please keep us all in your pravers as we finalize the figures.

Capital Campaign and General Money Market Update:

At the end of December, the overall Money Market account balance should be \$50,165. Of this amount, the major elements are: \$23,244 as the posted Capital Campaign balance, and \$15,142 as the posted net Rectory balance (\$1,500 Security Deposit + \$13,642 Rectory Reserves).
