Dear Grace Church Family,

The line above from a song that was popular when I was in High School (dates me doesn't it) is for many of us a fond memory of earlier and, perhaps, simpler times. Today, it seems, summer is not the time of rest and refreshment that it once was. The level of activity doesn't really slow down much and, increasingly, the idea of an extended family vacation, which used to be the hallmark of the summer season, has slipped away from many of us. Our children (and grandchildren) are just as busy as they are during the School Year and with the economic pressures that many families are feeling it is harder and harder to figure our how or to afford to spend significant time away. That's really unfortunate as we are all reminded these days of the need that we have to find "quiet time" or time that we can spend with family and friends for re-creation.

This is a theological issue as well for as we read throughout the New Testament, Jesus understood the need for balance in his life and in the lives of the disciples sharing in his ministry. It is for this reason that we read regularly in the Gospel narrative that Jesus would withdraw by himself or with a few close friends for prayer and renewal. The times of refreshment were particularly important following the major teaching missions which Jesus undertook or at times in his ministry when he knew momentous events or significant change was at hand. We need to pay attention to the Lord's example because it is equally important for us to understand our need for renewal.

In the last few weeks, several members of our Parish family have asked me for places they could go for some spiritual time away. Some have wanted to do it solo, some with spouses/partners and some with their entire family. There are lots of good resources around that can provide this kind or spiritual refreshment for a day, a weekend or a week. If you are interested please speak with me or with CJ and we will be glad to share our thoughts with you. Taking time for ourselves and our own spiritual renewal is an important part of being God's people on mission. We can't respond to the opportunities that God offers us to work for the building up of the Kingdom if we are spiritually exhausted. This kind of opportunity provides the chance for renewal and refreshment and is just as important as other opportunities for re-creation that have been, or are, a part of our other summer traditions.

Spiritual renewal at Grace Church is particularly important this summer as we are on the cusp of many important components of the calling process for our new Priest and we will want to be filled with energy and possibilities as he/she begins to minister with and among us in this Parish. So, in short, my hope and prayer for all of us is that we will use this summer season for our renewal and recommitment to the work of being God's people in this place and at this time.

Have a joyous, wonder filled and refreshing season of renewal and recommitment!

### Pastoral Care at Grace Episcopal Church

As we strive to become more intentional and demonstrative in our care and concern for each other, it is of the greatest importance that you contact the church if you are ill or in the hospital. "In case of illness, the Minister of the Congregation is to be notified." Book of Common Prayer (BCP) p. 453. Current privacy laws do not allow the hospital to contact the clergy or to release names of patients. The only way that the church will know of your hospitalization is if you or a friend or family member call, the parish office to alert us. The same holds true for an illness where a pastoral visit would be welcome.

When we are aware of a hospitalization or illness, our pastoral care ministry reaches out through prayers, visits, phone calls, cards, rides and Eucharist taken to the home or hospital. Eucharist is taken either by the clergy or by a trained and licensed Lay Eucharist Visitor (LEVs). Our LEVs are able to take communion directly from the service to members of our parish family at retirement homes, hospitals or at home when

they cannot come to church. If you are interested in becoming a LEV please talk with Father David.

With Marie Ritchie as our new Prayer Chain coordinator, we have updated the list of those we pray for daily as well as for those who are included in the Prayers of the People. Prayer requests may be made by contacting Marie directly or by contacting the church office at 860-666-3331. The prayer box on the shelf in the Narthex may also be used as Marie will be checking it on a regular basis.

Did you know we have a card ministry as well? Marie has been very faithful over the years in sending out birthday cards to those who have birthdays listed in the weekly bulletin. Cards have been donated, handmade and store bought. Recently, JoAnn Cromwell has joined this ministry and has expanded it to include those parishioners who are in need, such as our shut-ins who can't come to church, our elderly who have a harder time coming on a regular basis and to those who are ill or recovering from surgery. We also have sent cards to those who have recently given birth, graduated from college or to those who are going through tough times and just need a word of encouragement. This is a loving ministry that is very heart-felt, thoughtful and meaningful. It is touching to know that someone remembers and cares and that they are praying daily for your well-being.

On the Sundays we have fresh flowers on the Altar, our Altar Guild prepares a bouquet or two for delivery to parishioners at home or in the hospital recovering from an illness or surgery. When there is nobody on that list, the flowers are delivered on a rotating schedule to our shut-ins.

If you are interested in volunteering to help with Pastoral Care, please contact JoAnn Cromwell, Pastoral Care Team Leader. This ministry is part of the new A.P.O.S.T.L.E. structure for ministries within the church.

Our CPA has the data now for our 2013 financial review, so we will have our "audit" back to the Diocese before the end of the summer. Hopefully, our finances continue at a similar rate to support our expenses. We will make provision to make the \$4,500 budgeted from reserves available to the General Fund in July if needed, and will review August as we go. Please try to remember Grace if you are away for summer activities. As an aside, second quarter statements will be available in early July so you can verify your giving to date and compare against what you had planned to give by mid year.

#### Capital Campaign and General Money Market Update:

At the end of June, the overall Money Market account balance should be \$56,282. Of this amount, the major

elements are: \$29,202 as the posted Capital Campaign balance, and \$15,142 as the posted net Rectory balance (\$1,500 Security Deposit + \$13,642 Rectory Reserves). The new computers have been paid for and are being installed. The next expense from the Capital funds will be to replace the office Canon copier and Risograph duplicator with a new high capacity business copier which should happen in July or early August.
