

**General Fund Update:** June is now the first month that both our calculated operating balance and our actual checkbook balance have shown a net decrease – in the amounts of (\$1400 & \$1,200). Even so, our operating balance is still \$2,000 ahead of the budget prediction, and the overall checkbook balance is a healthy \$18,467. This month, both the expenses and the income were below the predicted amounts, but the income was the lower figure. It looks like our traditional summer slowdown has started, so it is very important that we all keep up with our pledges – even if we are away.
