Gifts of the Spirit and God's Mission for the Church

Dear Grace Church Family,

As we turn the page of the calendar to June we are all aware that the summer season is upon us and, I suspect, many of us hope and look forward to a respite from the level of activity that we encounter during the "program year". However, this is not a typical year, if there ever was such a thing, and there is much for us to do. The month is ushered in with the celebration of the feast of the Ascension (May 29) which we celebrate on June 1. This marks the return of the risen Christ to the realm of His Father (and ours) in heaven. One week later we observe the day of Pentecost when, as Christ promised, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples and the mantle of leadership was placed upon their shoulders. This was all foretold by Jesus and we have been focused on this transition throughout the Easter season and now we stand with the apostles on the threshold of the next chapter of the story of God's salvation. The day of Pentecost (June 8 this year) falls some fifty days after Easter (hence its name) and is sometimes called "the birthday of the Church". If we think about it that way and draw out the analogy, we have certainly been blessed with an abundance of birthday presents. All that is left is for us to embrace and then use the gifts that we have been given. This is, of course, the challenge. Jesus assured the disciples, as he assures us, that all of the gifts that will be required to carry out God's mission* have been given to us. It is up to us to discern how to use those gifts and the story of that process of faithful discernment fills volumes of the history of the church and introduces us to the holy women and holy men who have down through the centuries be the loyal and faithful followers of God who have tried as best they could to do God's work. We hear about the triumphs as well as about the failures but we learn that the mission of God goes on. That brings us to the celebration of Pentecost in 2014 at Grace Church here in Newington. We have been abundantly and creatively gifted and at this juncture in our history and experience as a community of faith we are called to discern what is next.

We have recently adopted a new mission statement. It affirms that our mission is, "to renew, to serve, and to accept all people as we grow together in Christ". Good enough but how do we do that? Of course, that's the urgent question that lies ahead of us. Do we really believe that we possess the abundance of the gifts of the Spirit to accomplish the mission we have affirmed? I firmly believe that we do but that it will require the active participation of every member of our parish family to move us forward. No one can stand on the sidelines. Everyone's gifts are vital and urgently needed. We are called to set aside many things that are comfortable and familiar and to embrace the challenge of exploring new seas where God will push back the horizons of our hope. It does not matter hope insignificant you may feel your gifts are. They are critical to God's mission and ours here at Grace Church.

During June and the summer months that will follow, the Vestry and the Discernment team will be working on goals which will help to shape our missional journey as we prepare to call a new Rector. At the same time the APOSTLE** ministry teams will be forming and working to identify specific goals and objectives in each of their respective ministry areas that will help to advance and further define to overall goals of the congregation. All of us need to be a part of this process and to support by our prayers and action the work of actualizing God's mission in, by, and for Grace Church. Please don't wait to be asked and don't hold back as your participation is vital. Speak to one of the Wardens, to CJ or to me and we will help to connect you and to make you a critical part of our mission strategy.

May God abundantly bless us as we seek faithfully to do the work that God has given us to do!
