

The Spirit's Gifts for Mission

Dear Grace Church Family,

As we move into the fullness of the return of spring, we prepare for the abundance of God's gifts given to us at baptism and recalled each year as we celebrate the feast of Pentecost. Pentecost always falls fifty days after Easter (hence the name) and, therefore is a movable feast depending upon the date of Easter. Pentecost has been called the "birthday of the church" because it marks that moment when the responsibility for carrying God's mission forward comes to rest upon the disciples. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are designed to enable them to take the next steps in expanding the work which Jesus began during his ministry. They weren't sure that they were ready to take this work on and there were many who approached the task with uncertainty and apprehension but in faithfulness they moved forward. They knew that the Teacher had promised that they would receive all the gifts they needed to equip them for the work. The story of what happened next is recorded in the Acts of the Apostles and in the histories of the early church.

What does this have to do with us? We are the inheritors of the work which the apostles began. We may feel no more equipped than they did but I can assure all of us that the gifts we need to move forward are already in our midst. We simply need to identify them and call those gifts into the work of mission. We have been through a difficult and lengthy process and, as a result of the hard work of the Vestry and Transition Team have discerned that we are ready to call a Missional Priest and to embrace the work of being a Missional Baptismal Community. We are still in the process of fully understanding what that means and this is our next task. We have already made an important start and one upon which we will be building over the summer and into our new program year. This start is built on the A.P.O.S.T.L.E model and the related Ministry Teams we have and continue to put in place.

The key to the work of the Ministry Teams is to actively identify and encourage the further development of the ministry gifts needed for us to become a truly missional community. This will require us to dig deep and identify the many gifts of the Spirit that are already present in our parish family and to take proactive steps to nurture and develop those additional gifts needed to move us forward in mission. Pentecost for us needs to become and ongoing and creative reality not just on the Day of Pentecost but every day. I find that prospect exciting and energizing and I hope that you do as well.

You will be hearing more about this in the weeks ahead and I hope that all of us will prayerfully consider how we might advance the journey of faith here at Grace as we grow together into the promise of embracing being a Missional Baptismal Community.

General Fund Update:

With a wonderful Easter and finally some nice spring weather, April continued in at least a minor positive direction. With a continuing healthy balance in the checkbook, we were able to return \$1,200 to the Money Market reserves that we "borrowed" in December as a buffer for a special pre-payment for an activity towards the end of this year. Please note that the utilities are still a significant expense, and that although we didn't have a snow plowing invoice that was paid in April, we do have one final invoice for \$1,135 to be paid in about 2 weeks.
