

In the next week or so, there will be an envelope in the Narthex for each one of you who completed a Family Promise survey earlier this year.

As it has been stated, it looks as though the Day Center in New Britain will be ready in the beginning of February. Presently there is no host church rotation schedule set-up yet as the affiliate continues to secure commitments from area houses of worship.

The wardens, along with Father David and the vestry, feel ites important to get a recommitment from each of you and the parish as a whole as we move closer to a roll-out date. We recognize that circumstances and priorities may make it more of a challenge for some to participate at the level you had initially hoped to. And of course there were some hold-outs among you as you evaluated whether or not this was really going to fly and you werengt prepared to make a commitment so early in the process. Well, now you have an opportunity to become involved as there will be much to do to get ready and for each rotation week we are on the schedule. Between our participation and the support of Our Savior, our support parish, we had all of the major tasks covered for each rotation week. That level of commitment so early in the process was very gratifying and a big relief. We want to make sure it is still is the case as we inch forward.

The envelope will contain a copy of your initial survey and some sort of recommitment form. It may be a whole new survey or it may be some sort of form that needs to be completed and signed. As of this writing we havenot quite worked out those details.

My commitment to Family Promise hasn't wavered from when we were first asked to participate. My natural inclination as a human being has always been to help a brother or sister in need and my compassion index, as I call it, kicks in at the least little sign of distress. There are many Biblical teachings that implore us to be mindful of the suffering of others and what better way to show our gratitude for all that God has given us than to make a recommitment to the mission of Family Promise and to "Love thy neighbor as thyself."

#### Family Promise Fundraisers



Family Promise of Central CT

On Saturday, October 8th "Walk Away Homelessness" was held at Walnut Hill Park, New Britain. Walk started at 10 AM. There were 230 walkers and many volunteers helping with registration, stamping hands and handing out T-shirts. \$54,000.00 was raised.

There was also an anonymous match of up to \$1,000 for CORE group challenge, collection exceeded the match.

We anticipate this becoming an annual event.

There is now \$76,000.00 in the FPCC account.. Huge success! We now have enough monies on hand (half annual budget) to begin the process of looking for a day center director; from there we will look for a social worker and van driver. These are the only paid positions in the affiliate. According to the national affiliate we have moved from CORE group status to Board of Director run. We have a board of directors in place and looking at a smooth transition. Update on day center at 40 Cornelius Way, New Britain: new siding, windows, porch, roof (previously done), will need to paint rooms (will need volunteers) and also basement windows and doors need repair. One of our CORE member lives across the street and says it looks beautiful. We won't make December but expect to be ready to open for occupancy by February (need to have director in place 6 weeks prior to opening). We are also looking for two more host churches to make goal of thirteen hosts, and a used 14 passenger van for transportation of homeless families between host church, day center and children to schools. Host churches need to be within 30 miles of New Britain. At present count we have total of 18 churches involved. Check out the "Heartbeat" newsletter posted on our bulletin board from September, I will be posting as I receive them.

We will have to watch carefully as we move into the fall and winter and the associated increased expenses. Please stay involved as best as you can as we enjoy several planned activities coming up. Also watch for various Property and Maintenance projects where we could use help to continue improving the overall upkeep of the building.

#### Capital Campaign and General Money Market Update:

At the end of September, the overall Money Market account balance was \$53,083. Of this amount, the major elements are: \$23,868 as the posted Capital Campaign balance, and \$12,487 as the posted net Rectory balance (\$1,500 Security Deposit + \$10,987 Rectory Reserves). Note that this balance recently covered an expense of \$2,655 to complete a badly needed upgrade to the kitchen counters.
