Dear Friends at Grace,



For the next few months the Grace Church Book Club will morph into more of an Adult Forum format. The intent is to draw more people into the discussion of affirming racial healing and the role of the church in that process. This is a

subject the church is devoting a lot of discussion to.

It was a topic of an afternoon workshop at the recent Episcopal Diocese of CT convention. And it is also where the book Waking Up White by Debby Irving came from. The Grace Church Book Club had decided to read the book for its September gathering. Those who read the book agreed the book warrants more time so a meaningful conversation can take place and some of the broader issues can be addressed.

To that end the next 3 months of the standard book club will divide the book into sections. The first date is Saturday, November 10 and we will discuss Sections 1-3, Chapters 1-16.

Since we are following the book club schedule there will be no December meeting. We will resume in January to discuss Sections 4-6, Chapters 17-33. The January date is Saturday, January 12, 2019.

The last discussion will take place on Saturday, February 9, 2019 and will include Sections 7-.9, Chapters 34-46.

We are excited to have CJ facilitate our discussions. She attended the convention and will have insight into the important points coming out of the workshop discussions and possible next steps.

Here are the four questions delegates of the conversation voted on to discuss in their workshop:

How do we meaningfully engage ECCT in the existing work of serving God's mission among the poor and the marginalized?

How can ECCT raise awareness of the sin of racism in our Church and promote racial healing toward true racial reconciliation?

In these changing times and the consequent needs of our worshipping communities, what are our expectations of priesthood leadership currently defined in ECCT as missional, provisional, conditional or part time?

How would the practice of Open Communion change the life of the church?

All thought provoking questions for sure. And not questions to be answered in one afternoon or three afternoons. The history of racism in the Episcopal Church is not unlike the history of racism in this country. The subject deserves our full attention and best practices to heal the divide that continues today.
