Dear Grace Church Family,

Many churches are named Grace but what does the name really mean? As most of you know, we are in the process of designing a new logo for the parish and a number of you are working on a symbol that will visually represent our name. Grace is an unmerited gift of God's love given us in order that we may be strengthened to do the work which God calls the faithful to be about. Grace is not something that we can earn rather it is an unmerited and unearned expression of God's love for us as expressed in the ultimate gift of Jesus Christ. We are not just recipients of grace but, moreover, are called to be ambassadors of God's grace reaching out in love, hope and faith to those around us. We ask God to shower us with grace so that in turn, following Christ's example, we may shower grace on others.

As we have been thinking about the future of Grace Church as we prepare to move forward in the process of calling the next Rector of this congregation, we have all become aware of the challenges that face more and more of our brothers and sisters. The reality is that we are a community of faith that is being confronted by the aging of our still vibrant and faith filled congregation. More and more we are aware of the reality that here in Connecticut the numbers of those who find themselves asset limited and income constrained is growing. We watch the increased demand on our town food pantry and on the other social services available in our community. As your interim, I have become ever more aware of the economic pinch that s growing number of our brothers and sisters are confronting.

In a recent discussion with the Vestry, we considered what we might be able to do to help. Out of that discussion came a resource for channeling God's grace that will be known simply as The Grace Fund. This fund builds on the old concept of a rector's discretionary fund but expands it to make it a ministry in which the whole congregation can participate. The idea is a simple one built on our commitment together to be ambassadors of grace. It is a confidential way for us to help brothers and sisters. It will not replace to outreach ministries in which we serve those beyond our congregation but it is another vehicle to express God's love for those closest to us.

There will be a simple set of guidelines for using the fund and all members of the Parish are invited to be contributors, as they are able, to help The Grace Fund grow. All you need to do is to make sure that your gift is clearly designated for the Fund by so noting on the memo line of your check or with a letter of instruction addressed to the Wardens or to me. All contribution to the Fund or gifts from it will remain anonymous.

The Grace Fund Guidelines:

- 1. Gifts from the Fund, except under extraordinary circumstances, will not exceed \$1,000.
- 2. Only Adult Communicants in Good Standing at Grace Church will be eligible to request a gift from the Fund.
- 3. Gifts from the Fund will be made payable only to a designated third party (e.g. a bank, mortgage company, utility)
- 4. Recipients of gifts from the Fund will be encouraged to repay the gift when and as they are able.
- 5. Gifts from the Fund are limited to one in any twelve month period although, under extraordinary circumstances, an exception can be made.

- 6. One week's notice will generally be required for a disbursement from the Fund.
- 7. Parishioners desiring to request a gift from the Fund should speak with the Rector or with one of the Wardens.
- 8. Decisions about gifts from the Fund will be made by the Rector, the Wardens and the Treasurer acting together on behalf of our Parish family.

It is my hope that this Fund will be another channel of Grace that strengthens our fellowship and expands God's mission in this community of faith.



After a really positive August (due to 5 Sundays and a special donation), it is a little discouraging to see September receipts decline to just over July's figures from the middle of our summer slowdown. All September invoices and payroll are paid out, and although we will show about a \$2,200 deficit for the month, the checkbook still has a reasonable balance to get us safely into October. In fact, our balance is just about where we started off at the beginning of the year, and we haven't had to use any of the \$4,500 reserves provided for in the budget.

Overall, our September deposits fell below expected levels, but I hope some of this is due only to some deferred donations from some pledges and some outside groups. Of particular note not shown in the above figures is that a special anonymous one-time donation of \$7,500 (actually received in August) was moved directly over into our Money Market reserves until proper use of the funds can be determined. In addition, we had several unusual expenses that could be offset in the future. One was a \$900 outreach expense from our newly established Grace Fund, and another was the \$800 deposit for our upcoming Animal Embassy special event. Beyond those, the balances of our September expenses aren't really out of line. Please join in the excitement for what is shaping up to be a very eventful fall season.

#### Capital Campaign and General Money Market Update:

At the end of September, the overall Money Market account balance should be \$58,218. Of this amount, the major elements are: \$23,619 as the posted Capital Campaign balance, and \$15,142 as the posted net Rectory balance (\$1,500 Security Deposit + \$13,642 Rectory Reserves). In addition, the special donation of \$7,500 mentioned above is being temporarily held. A special expense of \$1,503 was paid for landscape cleanup of the Memorial garden (which had gotten badly overgrown) as a deferred maintenance item from the Capital Campaign funds.
