Getting to Know You

Dear Grace Church Family,

The title of this piece may be familiar as it is the title of one of the songs from the popular musical *The King and I (aka Anna and the King of Siam).* Anna sings the song early in her relationship with the King as the tutor of his children as she is seeking to better understand the family and the country of which she is to be a part. It is a reminder that we all need to grow our relationships with one another and to share, as is appropriate, our stories so we can grow together as the church family we are called to be within Newington, as the Episcopal Church in Connecticut, the Anglican Communion and, most importantly, as God's people sharing, as brothers and sisters, in working for God's mission in the world. One of the realities for many of us is that we do not have the close geographical connection with families that our parents and their siblings so often had. Many of the family connections are long distance ones not easy to maintain as easily as many of us would like. For example my only sibling lives in Hawaii and our only child and her family live outside of Boston. Increasingly we look for other "extended social networks" or surrogate families that can help to meet those needs that in former times were met by our biological familial relationships. For many, the church community becomes one, perhaps even the most important, of those surrogate families or social networks.

All of this is by way of an introduction to a request that we will all be receiving from the Wardens and Vestry to share emergency contact information that would assist the Wardens, the Priest and the Parish Administrator to reach out in a time of critical or urgent need. The information that you will be invited to share will be held in a secure setting under lock and key and with very limited access. Another aspect of this "getting to know you" theme is the gathering of "end of life" instructions. Most of us, I hope, have given the necessary medical and legal instructions. This includes, of course, an up to date will. If you wish to share copies of this information, we will keep it securely in your "getting to know you" file along with the emergency contact information. All too often when I sit down with family members at the time of a death and ask if there are any specific scripture passages, hymns or other details that should be a part of the planning for a funeral, they know of none and we are unable to find any instructions. If you

have not done so, I encourage all of us to complete one of the end of life planning instruction booklets available from the Parish Office.

Finally, please consider what else we, as your Parish Family, ought to know about you that might be helpful to include in your "getting to know you file" (e.g. information about pets and their care) in case you are incapacitated or not available should a pet emergency or need arise. We will also be trying to introduce some opportunities this year to consider other ways in which we might strengthen our connections as a parish family as we all face the challenges of being an aging and changing community.

General Fund Update:

July and August both followed June as the second and third months this year where both our calculated operating balance and our actual checkbook balance showed a net decrease. The total 3-month losses are \$4,910 operating, and \$3,672 for the checkbook. Hopefully, these results only reflect the summer slow-down, and things will pick up in the fall. The good news is that we are still ahead for the year because although our operating income is about 6% below budget, our expenses are about 13% below budget so our overall net operating balance is \$1,163 and the checkbook still has a healthy balance of \$16,007. I look forward to the balance of 2016 finishing as a good year for Grace Church.
