From the Missional Priest

Missional Or Mission-ish

Dear Grace Church Family,

We have declared that we are a Missional Congregation with a Missional Priest and an organizational structure that depends on dynamic and creative lay ministry for its leadership. What does that really mean and what has or will be changing at Grace Church because of this decision? This, and related questions, are at the heart of conversations that have been taking place, especially in the Vestry, over the last two years but what does this all mean? As we prepare to move forward following our Annual Parish Meeting last week, it seemed a good idea to try to provide a framework that might be helpful in understanding what it means to be a missional congregation rather than one uncertain of what this means. This conversation will be at the heart of our upcoming Vestry retreat but will, more importantly, be an important part of our larger conversations going forward in decisions such as those influencing, for example, how we will implement Family Promise in the next few months. Rather than trying to start with a theological dialogue about being a missional church, it seemed to me that it might be easier to engage our thinking by posing a series of questions and to invite all of us to prayerfully consider our answers. These questions are designed to help us consider what it means to be missional (i.e. fully understanding and supportive of this model of ministry versus a baptismal community that is trying out a new vocabulary that we don't fully understand). The guestions below are adapted from material from TREC-CT (the Episcopal Church in Connecticut/sometimes known as the Diocese) that is itself, and on a much larger scale, seeking to embrace becoming more missional in our shared approach to being the church in an increasingly changing and more complex world. Let me invite you to share your thoughts about the answers to these questions as "letters to the editor" of the Pace or in conversation with Vestry or clergy.

That said, here are the questions for you to ponder, and remember that there are no right answers' only honest and thoughtful opinions.


- 1. Are we focused on discerning what God is up to ahead of us out in the world in other words are we responsive to God's leadership rather than our own? OR
- 2. Are we focused on thinking about the church and what the church is doing for others?
- 3. Are we working to embrace a whole new life style? OR
- 4. Are we only adding on programs and activities?
- 5. In our relationships with others, are we looking for mutually transformative relationships which are truly expressions of reciprocity? OR
- 6. Are we choosing projects/ministries just to meet needs?
- 7. If the building were not there, what would we do next? OR
- 8. How do we better use our resources to respond to opportunities for reciprocity?

There are no quick or easy answers but our answers may well reveal God's invitation to missional action in our midst.

I look forward to your thoughtful response and active participation in our journey together.

New legislation effective dates are typically January 1st, July 1st, and October 1st in a calendar year. So, as 2016 comes to an end, we prepare for a number of new laws to take effect starting January 1, 2017. These new laws may have an impact on you, your business, or our community. I therefore encourage you to take a look at the full list of laws, which includes some of the noteworthy legislation listed below.

An Act Concerning Opioids and Access to Overdose Reversal Drugs

This new law, PA 16-43, puts a seven-day cap on prescriptions for opioid drugs. The bill also requires municipalities to train all first responders on the use of Narcan, a drug that may reverse an opioid overdose. In addition to this law, the state created a 24/7 opioid addiction. hotline: 1-800-563-4086.

Insurance Coverage for Tomosyntheis for Breast Cancer Screenings

This legislation requires certain Connecticut health insurance policies to cover, at the option of the beneficiary, breast tomosynthesis. Breast tomosynthesis is a three-dimensional mammogram. By law, such policies already cover baseline mammograms for women age 35 through 39, and annual mammograms for women age 40 or older.

An Act Concerning Fair Chance Employment

This law prohibits employers from asking prospective employees about their prior arrests, criminal charges, or convictions on an initial employment application unless the employer must do so under a state or federal law; or, if a prospective employee is applying for a position for which the employer must obtain a security, fidelity or equivalent bond.

Minimum Wage Increase to \$10.10 an Hour

Connecticut is one of fourteen states that will increase their minimum wage starting next year. The new rate will go from \$9.60 to \$10.10, starting January 1st.
