Dear Grace Church Family,

It hardly seems possible but the summer, for all practical purposes, is over. The unofficial end of the season will come as we celebrate Labor Day and as we watch our children return to their academic pursuits in school or college. Yes, the restful, at least I hope is that is what this summer has been for you, season is over and it is now time for us to turn our attention to the next steps in our journey of faith. It is time for us to remind ourselves that there is much work to be done as we continue to live in to God's call to us to be active members of the community of the way. Our transition work goes on apace and we look forward to having it bear fruit in the nearer future. In the meantime, there is much to do. As Saint Paul reminds the Christians in Rome, all of the gifts of the community, no matter how insignificant they may seem, are vital to carrying forward God's mission. As part of what you may choose to do about it, I hope that you will prayerfully consider renewing and, hopefully, expanding tour ministry as an apostle. We need all of us to be actively engaged. In case it has slipped your mind over these summer months, our APOSTLE ministry teams are:

- ✤ Administration (the nuts and bolts of keeping things moving forward and supporting the work of all of the teams)
- Pastoral Care (looking after the wellbeing of all of the apostles in this plce and in the broader community)
- Outreach (seeking out and serving those beyond our own Grace Church Community who are in need of God's presence through us in their lives)
- Stewardship (promoting the faithful use of the time, talents and treasure that God has entrusted to our care)
- ✤ Teaching and learning (designing and carrying forward a full program of Christian formation for ALL the members of the parish family)
- Liturgy (shaping and helping to design how we worship together when we gather to offer our prayers and praises)
- Evangelism (helping to find ways for all of us to tell the stories of our own faith journeys so that we may bring others to know Christ as their Lord and Savior

I look forward to welcoming everyone back as we begin another program year. I will see you at the Fair.

The Choir would love to have some new members this year! Whether you read music or just love to sing, we will teach you the notes and have fun in the process! There are no auditions and rehearsals are conveniently held on Sunday mornings from 8:15-8:50am before the service and then 10:30-11:30am (give or take on either side depending on service length) after the service. Even if you can only join us for special holidays, we would be very happy to have you sing with us!



Here is an update from our organist/choir director:

With the Yale Institute of Sacred Music, I traveled to Italy this summer. We were exposed to the art, architecture, music, and culture of each city through guided tours, lectures, and concerts. Some highlights...

- Ravenna: We sang Palestrina's *Sicut Cervus* in the Basilica of San Vitale, as we did in almost every church and cathedral we visited. Singing Italian Renaissance music in the cathedrals for which it was composed was one of my favorite parts of the entire trip. The spaces were again being used for their original purpose, not just as a tourist space. Seeing Dante's burial site and hearing world-renowned scholar Peter Hawkins speak about him here was also quite an experience.
- Siena: This typical medieval city is home to a very large Cathedral that is architecturally famous for the black and white marble used throughout the building. We also learned about the medieval chants and songs associated with St. Catherine of Siena.
- Florence: The Baptistery of the Duomo was probably my favorite place to sing. We had a private tour of the building and were able to lay down the floor and stare at the gorgeous ceiling mosaics for quite a long time. We also participated in Vespers at one of the monasteries in the city. There are many beautiful cathedrals in Florence, but climbing up Brunelleschi's dome on the Duomo was

artistically fascinating and made that my favorite cathedral in the city.

- Orvieto: On the path of pilgrims travelling • from Florence to Rome, Orvieto is home to a gorgeous Cathedral. This gothic-style Cathedral towers over the small city and houses 15th-century Dante-inspired frescoes.
- Rome: Of all Italian cities, Rome is probably • the most culturally inspiring and historically fascinating. The layers of history are apparent in Rome in an overwhelming manner. We participated in a vespers service at the Pontifical Institute of Sacred Music in Rome. We saw Tchaikovsky's ballet Sleeping Beauty in the Opera House. We descended through layers beneath the ground of churches such as the Basilica of San Clemente to see previous structures, all the way down to ancient Roman houses and then 1st century house churches. Seeing the catacombs was also quite an experience. It was also wonderful to hear Masses being sung in churches throughout the city.



Capital Campaign and General Money Market Update:

At the end of August, the overall Money Market account balance should be **\$52,415**. Of this amount, the major elements are: **\$**25,322 as the posted Capital Campaign balance, and **\$**15,142 as the posted net Rectory balance (**\$**1,500 Security Deposit + **\$**13,642 Rectory Reserves). The new computers have been paid for (**\$**6,231)and are being installed. The new office copier has been received and paid for,(**\$**3,880), and the old Risograph duplicator lease has been terminated.
