

#### **Family Promise Fundraiser**



Family Promise of Central Connecticut is in the home stretch of the almost 3 year journey of getting established in order to host homeless families in area houses of worship. It is extremely possible that we can open in December! We just need to raise approximately half the amount of the projected annual budget. This is very doable, and here's how:

- There are 18 confirmed host/support congregations in place.
- Each congregation signs up (at least) 20 walkers.
- Each walker raises \$200.00 in pledges.
   \$72,000 is raised!

So, on Saturday, October 8th at Walnut Hill Park in New Britain, Family Promise will host the "Walk Away Homelessness" event. The walk is a one-mile loop. It has the potential to raise significant funds if every committed host and support congregation participates. We would like to have 20 walkers for Grace. It doesn't matter how far you walk to raise the donation. 
#### FUTURE EVENTS PAINT NIGHT
