

Book Club: The Grace Church Book Club will meet on Saturday, September 14 as planned. There was some talk about rescheduling but the group has decided to meet as planned. The group meets in the church library from 2

Our summer selection read is "The Help" by Kathryn Stockett. While the book has been out since February 2009 and the movie was released in August of 2011, there are several in the group who haven't read the book or seen the movie. It was felt the themes and ensuing discussion would fit neatly with some of the past and current discussions in our church community as well as in our society today.

The idea that racial perspectives are open to change is the overarching theme of the book along with hypocrisy and integrity and doing the right thing. The story is told through the perspective of three women: two African American, both maids, and one white, the daughter of a prominent family in town. The book is set in Jackson, MS in the Jim Crow era. Against the rules of society, they end up becoming friends.

The characters are memorable and engaging. The story is beautiful and poignant while being real and filled with bigotry and hate; and laugh out loud funny in places. And the story gives perspective from both sides of the American racial divide. NPR puts it right up there in importance with "To Kill a Mockingbird." And Goodreads suggests it is a must read for every book club across America.

During our previous summer breaks we usually read two books. This summer our one and only selection is The Help. In September, please come with a list of recommendations for future book club selections. We will meet in October and November, taking a break in December and resuming in January. Happy Reading!

K is for KINDNESS

As part of my participation as a board member of both the Newington Interfaith Housing (NIH) and the Southfield Children's Center, I took on the responsibility of updating the Parent Policy Manual for the children's center since I have had previous experience in my career of policy manual writing. The task for NIH included organizing, editing, deleting, updating and adding new policies.

One of the policies the board has struggled with over the years is some sort of social media policy. The need for it came to a head last winter when someone went on a rant about the Center on social media. The board is sensitive to the importance of freedom of speech in our society as a fundamental human right. As you may be aware, NIH is a not for profit and we don't have a media or community relations type person on staff so our solution was to craft a policy that speaks to something so basic in our day to day living: the importance of kindness.

The following "policy" is from several sources. The opening quote is from a seminar I attended last year for work. And the THINK policy is posted in the hallways of one of the schools here in town. I don't know where it came from; no one seemed to know either. And the rest I put together to tie it all together.

It seems as though the policy is onto something since shortly after this was included in the parent manual, the Town of Newington rolled out its Building a Strong Community Kindness Counts movement with its focus on kindness. And the difference it makes in people's lives and within the community.

I thought I would share it with all of you as a simple reminder to all that we are and all that we do here at Grace Episcopal Church, Newington. And that no act of kindness, no matter how small, is ever wasted.

K is for KINDNESS

"In a world where you can be anything, be kind." Jennifer Dukes Lee What simple but powerful words, especially in today's world where it seems as though people are becoming meaner by the day, both in their actions and in their communications.

Communication touches the lives of those around us, both in large and small ways. It also has the power to impact people in a negative way or in a positive way. At the center, we try to encourage kindness, not negativity, in all that we do to make an impact in a positive, uplifting manner.

One way to measure this is to ask yourself: "Would I say this to someone standing right in front of me?" If the answer is no, it probably shouldn't be put in writing, or posted online either for that matter. A helpful way to check on the potential impact on someone is to put into the THINK policy:

Τ	is it	TRUE
Н	is it	HELPFUL
1	is it	INSPIRING
Ν	is it	NECESSARY
K	is it	KIND

If the answer is no to just one of these questions then it shouldn't be thought, spoken, written or posted. It becomes what our mothers used to tell us: If you don't have anything nice to say about someone, then don't say anything at all. In other words: "Watch your words".
