Dear Fellow Parishioners:

With the fading of the summer hot days and plentiful rain we look forward to the many activities planned at Grace this fall.

Services: Supply priests have been scheduled to lead our Sunday morning Eucharist Services and Christmas Eve and Day Masses. Starting in October one monthly Sunday service will be Morning Prayer with music. Morning Prayer is also held Tuesday mornings in the small Chapel at 8:30. A schedule of services is listed on the calendar in this newsletter.

Permanent Priest: We are in the process of working with the Diocese to find a permanent priest. With a budget that only permits a quarter time priest (the status of retired Father David), the Diocese has suggested we share a priest with Trinity of Wethersfield. Your Wardens have had numerous meetings with Trinity's Wardens and your Vestry will soon meet with their Vestry to discuss cooperation. Until the Diocese puts forth a candidate to interview, no specific plans can be made.

Creative Energy Team: This dedicated group has been busy this summer finalizing plans for its many events. Their fund raising activities are critical to our budget. Read the full details about the happenings in this newsletter including: Dining for Dollars in September, Fall Festival in October and the Holiday-Sing-Along and Silent Auction in December. Your support of these activities, both time and financial, is critical to their success.

High-Noon: The Hi-Noon group (made up of Grace parishioners and friends) enjoyed a lunch on the dock at Lobster Landing in Clinton followed by a short visit to Hammonasset Beach in July. Their next activities will be a visit to the Newington Farm Museum at the Kellogg-Eddy House in September and lunch and merriment at Gouveia Winery, Wallingford in October. Rectory Rental: The rectory has been rented to a Newington couple and their son. Special thanks to Mark Shoemaker for leadership of this project which is a welcomed and needed source of income.


North Central Region Convocation St. Albans in Simsbury:
